

TREE & SHRUB DESCRIPTIONS

EVERGREENS

SCOTCH PINE Grown in urban areas as an ornamental evergreen tree, in rural areas for erosion control and for Christmas trees. May grow 50 feet tall by 30 feet wide, with a slow to moderate growth rate.

NORWAY SPRUCE Grown in urban areas as an ornamental tree, commonly used as a windbreak. Adaptable to harsh conditions and prefers acidic soils. May grow 80 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a rapid growth rate.

COLORADO BLUE SPRUCE Display of blue or blue-silver needles. Prefers moist (not wet), acidic soils. Drought resistant once established. May grow 50 feet tall by 25 feet wide, with a slow to moderate growth rate.

AMERICAN ARBORVITAE Has scale-like leaves that are soft. Popular evergreen consumed by deer and other mammals during winter. Provides cover for mammals and birds year-round. Prefers moist, alkaline soils in partial to full sun. May grow 30 feet tall by 10 feet wide, with a medium growth rate.

SHRUBS

AMERICAN HAZELNUT Large shrub known for its tasty nuts for humans and wildlife. Member of the Birch family. Prefers reasonable well-drained soils. Best nut production occurs in full sun. May grow 15 feet tall by 15 feet wide, with a medium to rapid growth rate.

HIGHBUSH CRANBERRY Has an outer row of showy flowers and red fruits. Prefers moist to wet, acidic soils. May grow 12 feet tall by 12 feet wide, with a moderate growth rate.

DECIDUOUS TREES

AMERICAN BEECH Easily recognized by its smooth, steel-gray bark and tapering surface roots. Adaptable, but prefers rich soils that are well-drained, constant moisture. May grow 80 feet tall by 70 feet wide, with a slow growth rate.

AMERICAN PLUM Its fruits are sweet when fully ripe, and make excellent jelly or jam. Prefers moist, well-drained soils. May grow 25 feet tall by 20 feet wide, with a moderate growth rate.

SWEETGUM Shade tree prized for its brilliant fall colors and rapid growth. Prefers evenly moist, well-drained, slightly acidic soils. May grow 30 feet tall by 30 feet wide, with a medium to fast growth rate. ** NEW FOR 2019*

BLACK GUM Native, this tree is known for its glossy dark green summer foliage and outstanding autumn foliage colors. Fruits are greedily eaten by wildlife in late summer. Prefers moist, well-drained, acidic soils. May grow 60 feet tall by 25 feet wide, with a moderate growth rate.

SWEETBAY MAGNOLIA Flowers late in the spring, and attracts a wide variety of songbirds with its fall fruit. Prefers acidic, moist, well-drained soils. May grow 20 feet tall by 20 feet wide, with a medium to rapid growth rate.

PIN OAK Favorite oak to use as a shade tree, symmetrical with russet fall color. Thrives in partial to full sun. Prefers moist, acidic soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a moderate to rapid growth rate.

RED OAK Major timber tree, also an important shade tree in landscaping. Thrives in partial to full sun. Prefers moist, deep, well-drained soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 60 feet wide, with a rapid and vigorous growth rate.

WHITE OAK Native to eastern US. Fall color is reddish-brown to reddish-purple. Thrives in full sun. Prefers well-drained, acidic soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 70 feet wide, with a slow to moderate growth rate.

SHAGBARK HICKORY Native to most of the Eastern US. Has superior drought tolerance. Prefers deep, moist, rich, well-drained soils. May grow 100 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a moderate growth rate.

NORTHERN PECAN This is a nut-producing tree, yielding nuts for humans and wildlife. Prefers full sun. Grows in a variety of soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 30 feet wide, with a moderate growth rate. ** NEW FOR 2019*

RED MAPLE Popular shade tree with brilliant red fall color. Commonly found along creeks and bottomlands. Prefers moist to wet, acidic soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a medium to rapid growth rate.

SUGAR MAPLE Favorite shade tree with reliable fall color. Valued for its hard, dense, difficult-to-split wood. Can be used for maple sugaring. Prefers full to partial sun and well-drained soils. May grow 80 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a slow growth rate.

TULIP POPLAR Named for its showy flowers and the silhouette of its large leaves, both of which a tulip. Has a straight trunk. Prefers evenly moist, well-drained, slightly acidic soils. May grow 80 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a rapid growth rate.

PAWPAW This small tree is easily recognized by its large, tropical-looking foliage and prized for its delicious fruits that mature in late summer. Needs partial shade for establishment. Prefers moist, well-drained soils. May grow 25 feet tall by 15 feet wide, with a moderate growth rate.
