

## TREE & SHRUB DESCRIPTIONS

### EVERGREENS

#### WHITE PINE

A native that is commonly transplanted as a landscape tree and sold as a cut Christmas tree. Also logged for production of lumber, telephone poles and as pulp for the production of paper. May grow 80 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a rapid moderate growth rate.

#### NORWAY SPRUCE

Grown in urban areas as an ornamental tree, commonly used as a windbreak. Adaptable to harsh conditions and prefers acidic soils. May grow 80 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a rapid growth rate.

#### COLORADO BLUE SPRUCE

Display of blue or blue-silver needles. Prefers moist (not wet), acidic soils. Drought resistant once established. May grow 50 feet tall by 25 feet wide, with a slow to moderate growth rate.

#### AMERICAN ARBORVITAE

Has scale-like leaves that are soft. Native, popular evergreen consumed by deer and other mammals during winter. Provides cover for mammals and birds year-round. Prefers moist, alkaline soils in partial to full sun. May grow 30 feet tall by 10 feet wide, with a medium growth rate.

### DECIDUOUS TREES

#### WHITE FLOWERING DOGWOOD

This native tree is an excellent landscape choice. White flowers in spring, vibrant red-purple foliage in fall, glossy red fruit attracts winter songbirds. May grow 25 feet tall by 25 feet wide, with a moderate growth rate.

#### EASTERN REDBUD

This native tree has blooms of rosy pink flowers in April. Early blossoms attract early-season butterflies. Provides shelter for birds. May grow 30 feet tall by 35 feet wide, with a moderate to rapid growth rate.

#### RED OAK

Major timber tree, also an important shade tree in landscaping. This native thrives in partial to full sun. Prefers moist, deep, well-drained soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 60 feet wide, with a rapid and vigorous growth rate.

#### PIN OAK **New for 2021**

Native to eastern US. Offers dense shade and is easy to transplant. Fall color is scarlet and bronze. Thrives in full sun. Cannot tolerate alkaline soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a rapid growth rate.

#### WHITE OAK

Native to eastern US. Fall color is reddish-brown to reddish-purple. Thrives in full sun. Prefers well-drained, acidic soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 70 feet wide, with a slow to moderate growth rate.

#### PAPER BIRCH **New for 2021**

This native has a distinctive bark and golden fall color. Grows well in acidic, loamy, moist, sandy, well-drained and clay soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 35 feet wide, with a moderate to fast growth rate.

#### RED MAPLE

Popular shade tree with brilliant red fall color. Commonly found along creeks and bottomlands. Prefers moist to wet, acidic soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a medium to rapid growth rate.

#### BALD CYPRESS **New for 2021**

This native deciduous conifer features short needles arranged in pairs. Develops cypress knees in wet conditions. Prefers full sun and is adaptable to wet or dry conditions. May grow 70 feet tall by 25 feet wide, with a moderate growth rate.

#### TULIP POPLAR

Named for its showy flowers and the silhouette of its large leaves, both of which resemble a tulip. Has a straight trunk. Prefers evenly moist, well-drained, slightly acidic soils. May grow 80 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a rapid growth rate.

#### PAWPAW

This small tree is easily recognized by its large, tropical-looking foliage and prized for its delicious fruits that mature in late summer. Needs partial shade for establishment. Prefers moist, well drained soils. May grow 25 feet tall by 15 feet wide, with a moderate growth rate.

#### PERSIMMON **New for 2021**

This native tree produces sweet fruit with date-like flavor. The large, orange, edible fruit attracts wildlife. Grows well in partial shade and moist, rich soil. Two trees are necessary for fruit production. May grow up to 60 feet tall.

### SHRUBS

#### BLACK CHOKEBERRY **New for 2021**

High-antioxidant fruit is used in baking and to make jams, jellies, syrup, tea, juice and wine. Used in naturalized gardens, for erosion control, in windbreaks or excessively wet soils. Showy white flower cluster and fall colors of red, orange and purple. Prefers moist, well-drained soils. May grow 8 feet tall by 6 feet wide, with a slow to moderate growth rate.

#### BLACK ELDERBERRY **New for 2021**

A native suckering shrub. Tiny lemon scented flowers fire way to black fruits that can be used to make jams, jellies, pie fillings and wine. May grow 12 feet tall by 12 feet wide, with a medium to rapid growth rate.

#### CONCORD GRAPE-SEEDLESS **New for 2021**

High-antioxidant fruit is used in baking and to make jams, jellies, syrup, tea, juice and wine. Prefers moist, well-drained soils. May grow 25 feet tall by 20 feet wide, with a moderate growth rate.
