

TREE & SHRUB DESCRIPTIONS

EVERGREENS

AUSTRIAN PINE

Has a bold texture, fullness of foliage, dark-green needles and is adaptable to urban conditions. Adapts to a wide variety of environmental conditions. May grow 60 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a medium growth rate.

NORWAY SPRUCE

Grown in urban areas as an ornamental tree, commonly used as a windbreak. Adaptable to harsh conditions and prefers acidic soils. May grow 80 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a rapid growth rate.

COLORADO BLUE SPRUCE

Display of blue or blue-silver needles. Prefers moist (not wet), acidic soils. Drought resistant once established. May grow 50 feet tall by 25 feet wide, with a slow to moderate growth rate.

DECIDUOUS TREES

BALDCYPRESS

This native deciduous conifer features short needles arranged in pairs. Develops cypress knees in wet conditions. Prefers full sun and is adaptable to wet or dry conditions. May grow 70 feet tall by 25 feet wide, with a moderate growth rate.

DAWN REDWOOD **New for 2022*

A deciduous conifer producing small, round 1/2" to 1" cones. It has a neat pyramidal shape in youth, maturing to a more rounded crown. The bright green, feathery leaves turn orange-brown or reddish-brown in the fall. Fast growing & easily transplanted. Grows to 100 feet tall with 25 foot spread, very fast growing.

RED OAK

Major timber tree, also an important shade tree in landscaping. This native thrives in partial to full sun. Prefers moist, deep, well-drained soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 60 feet wide, with a rapid and vigorous growth rate.

PIN OAK

Native to eastern US. Offers dense shade and is easy to transplant. Fall color is scarlet and bronze. Thrives in full sun. Cannot tolerate alkaline soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a rapid growth rate.

WHITE OAK

Native to eastern US. Fall color is reddish-brown to reddish-purple. Thrives in full sun. Prefers well-drained, acidic soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 70 feet wide, with a slow to moderate growth rate.

NORTHERN PECAN

This is a nut-producing tree, yielding nuts for humans and wildlife. Prefers full sun. Grows in a variety of soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 30 feet wide, with a moderate growth rate.

RED MAPLE

Popular shade tree with brilliant red fall color. Commonly found along creeks and bottomlands. Prefers moist to wet, acidic soils. May grow 70 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a medium to rapid growth rate.

SUGAR MAPLE

Favorite shade tree with reliable fall color. Valued for its hard, dense, difficult to split wood. Can be used for maple sugaring. Prefers full to partial sun and well-drained soils. May grow 80 feet tall by 40 feet wide with a slow growth rate.

TULIP POPLAR

Named for its showy flowers and the silhouette of its large leaves, both of which resemble a tulip. Has a straight trunk. Prefers evenly moist, well-drained, slightly acidic soils. May grow 80 feet tall by 40 feet wide, with a rapid growth rate.

PAWPAW

This small tree is easily recognized by its large, tropical-looking foliage and prized for its delicious fruits that mature in late summer. Needs partial shade for establishment. Prefers moist, well drained soils. May grow 25 feet tall by 15 feet wide, with a moderate growth rate.

BLACK CHERRY **New for 2022*

A large, native tree found in the Midwest and throughout the eastern US. The showy white flowers appear as pendulous clusters in early spring, followed by dark, pea-sized fruits in late summer. The mature bark is dark and scaly, often flipping up on the edges. Grows to 60 feet high by 30 feet wide.

SHRUBS

COMMON LILAC

Old-fashioned, long-lived and best known for its fragrant flowers. Extremely hardy and thrives with little care. May grow 20 feet tall by 10 feet wide, with a medium growth rate.

BLACK ELDERBERRY

A native suckering shrub. Tiny lemon scented flowers fire way to black fruits that can be used to make jams, jellies, pie fillings and wine. May grow 12 feet tall by 12 feet wide, with a medium to rapid growth rate.

FRUITS & VEGETABLES

HIMROD GRAPES- Sold Individually **New for 2022*

A vigorous deciduous vine with bold-textured, deep green foliage. Grown for its clusters of small, entirely seedless, crisp sweet, early season fruit that turns golden yellow when fully ripe in the summer. Works well for an ornamental vine on an arbor or trellis or trailing along fences. Excellent for eating as a sweet dessert grape.

EARLIGLOW STRAWBERRY **New for 2022*

A variety of strawberry that produces fruit that has a firm, glossy skin, firm flesh and medium size. Its sweet flavor makes the variety excellent for fresh eating and freezing. Vigorous and runner well. Recommended for beginners.

JERSEY KNIGHT ASPARAGUS **New for 2022*

Extremely vigorous, has large, succulent spears, and quickly attracts a loyal following. The flavor is excellent, and the plant is resistant to rust, crown rot and fusarium. It also performs equally well in heavy, clay-like soils.
